Our Lady of Medjugorje's Message Given to Marija Pavlovic-Lunett

October 25, 2014

"Dear children! Pray in this time of grace and seek the intercession of all the saints who are already in the light. From day to day may they be an example and encouragement to you on the way of your conversion. Little children, be aware that your life is short and passing. Therefore, yearn for eternity and keep preparing your hearts in prayer. I am with you and intercede before my Son for each of you, especially for those who have consecrated themselves to me and to my Son. Thank you for having responded to my call."

Commentary on the October 25, 2014 Message

Our Lady's October message to the world calls us to reflect on the upcoming Solemnity of All Saints. We are all a part of God's grand plan of salvation. We are the Communion of Saints: The Church triumphant in Heaven – The Church suffering in purgatory – The Church militant on earth. We are all one Church united under Christ. Our Lady calls us to be aware of this union by asking us to seek the intercession of all the saints who already bask in the Light of the beatific vision.

This beautiful reminder assures us that we are never

alone. If we could just live in this reality life could be easier for all of us. Our Faith would be firmer, our hope would be surer and our love would be undivided. We have 'BFF's' – (best friends forever) who are present to us day to day. Their lives and struggles are our examples. Their difficulties assure us that saints are not born – they are formed through the obstacles, challenges and sufferings of life. Grace helps them to persevere through their way of the Cross. Their lives encourage us; but not only through their stories. They encourage us through actual grace that permits them to be present to us when we call upon them. We have read many stories about the roses that St. Therese, the Little Flower of Jesus, sends to those who pray her novena. How many items have been found due to the intercession of St. Anthony? St. Jude and St. Rita (the saints attributed to difficult cases) have miraculously interceded in difficult situations. In fact, we have a Saint in Heaven designated for everything that ails us! What more could we ask for?

On this Solemnity of All Saints, we should ask for their help in our individual conversions. We are the Church militant who are engaged in battle. Our battle is with the powers and principalities who comprise the Devil's army. We cannot fight this spiritual battle alone. We need all the help we can get. Who better to call

upon than those who have fought the good fight before us.....and won! Every day we fight against temptations from the flesh, the world and the devil. We get weary, discouraged, weak, and sometimes we even succumb to despair. We need the help of the Saints! They are with us in spirit. Ask for their help!

There is nothing that reminds us of our mortality more than when we attend the funeral of a loved one! It is at these times that the pause button on our lives is pressed. Life as usual ceases for a day or so and we are forced to answer the tough questions concerning life and death. Our awareness of the fact that our lives are short and passing hits us hard. This month, as we celebrate the glories of Heaven through the Solemnity of All Saints and remember the poor souls who still suffer purification in purgatory, Our Lady tells us that our lives, too, are passing quickly. We need to be reminded that our journey through life is brief. What is the span of a human life – 70 -90 years – when compared to eternity?

It is so important that we spend the month of November – the month that the Church has designated to remember those who have gone before us – reflecting on the brevity of our own lives. In faith, hope and love we will prepare for that wonderful day on which we yearn to hear, “Come, good and faithful servant, inherit the Kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world”.

But for now, we are still in the battle, marching toward the victory. For those of us who have consecrated ourselves to the Immaculate Heart of Mary, we rejoice as we continue on the surest, quickest, easiest path to our Lord, Jesus Christ. Mary, Herself, - our Mother – is our General.

O God, fount of all holiness, make us each walk worthily in our vocation, through the intercession of your Saints, on whom you bestowed a great variety of graces on earth and a single glorious reward in heaven. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever.

“Dear children, With motherly love I implore you, love one another. May there be in you hearts, as my Son desired from the very beginning, love for the Heavenly Father and for your neighbour in the first place - above everything of this world. Comprehend that salvation is in true values. Accept the might of the Heavenly Father, love Him and honor Him. Walk in the footsteps of my Son. You, my children, my dear

apostles, you are always gathering around me anew, because you are thirsty. You thirst for peace, love and happiness. Drink out of my hands. My hands are offering to you my Son who is the spring of clear water. He will bring your faith back to life and purify your hearts, because my Son loves pure hearts and pure hearts love my Son. Only pure hearts are humble and have firm faith. I ask for such hearts of you, my children. My Son told me that I am the mother of the entire world. I ask of those of you who accept me as such to help me, with your life, prayer and sacrifice, for all of my children to accept me as a mother - so that I may lead them to the spring of the clear water. My dear children, as your shepherds offer you the Body of my Son with their blessed hands, always in your hearts give thanks to my Son for the sacrifice and for the shepherds that He always gives you anew.”
